One tip I have shared from my own personal experience, is to check your child's phone at random times, as they can become very good at working out when their phone might be checked and can delete apps beforehand, and then reinstall them the next day!

Finally, since introducing the On Time and Ready to Learn dojos, we have seen a big improvement in punctuality. This is so helpful, as teachers start teaching their first lesson at 9am promptly, so if children are sat down on time, they aren't missing any learning at all.
