

Overview of the Teaching and Learning at Shawlands Primary School

Shawlands' key learning priorities for every child are:

- High quality teaching and learning experiences which ensure all children are equipped with the qualities and skills that will enable them to be confident and successful learners
- Teaching our 6 'Be' values which inspire our children to be successful, both now and in adult life, so that they actively and effectively contribute to their communities and society in a positive manner
- Building cultural capital in all children, regardless of their background, so that they have the knowledge, understanding and experiences needed to be successful in modern society and their career.
- Creating independent, responsible, resilient students who are intrinsically motivated to achieve for their own self-worth.
- Engaging learners in an exciting, challenging and creative approach to learning
- Consolidation and application of numeracy and literacy skills across all subjects to continually raise standards
- Making links with the community around us through enterprise and collaborative learning events with parents and the wider community
- Learning from the world around us (using the school grounds and surrounding area as well as regular educational visits and visitors.)


Barnsley PHE Statistic that help inform our curriculum:

We are significantly worse than the England average in the following areas:

- Children in relative low income families
- GCSE attainment: average Attainment 8 score
- Children killed or seriously injured on England's roads
- Children with experience of visually obvious dental decay
- Hospital admissions for dental cavities
- Under 18s conception rate
- Teenage mothers
- Admission episodes for alcohol-specific conditions Under 18s
- Hospital admissions due to substance misuse (15-24 years)
- 24 Smoking status at time of delivery
- Baby's first feed breastmilk
- A&E attendances (0-4 years)
- Hospital admissions as a result of self-harm (10-24 years)

Concerns into adulthood:

- Alcohol-specific hospital stays (under 18s)
- Alcohol-related harm hospital stays
- Smoking prevalence in adults (aged 18+)
- Physically active adults (aged 19+)
- Excess weight in adults (aged 18+)
 - (Though children's obesity levels are in-line than the England average)
- Excess winter deaths
- Violent Crimes



Curriculum Intention - How does Shawlands set out the knowledge and skills the pupil require?

At Shawlands, our intention is that all children have the opportunity to gain the knowledge, skills and understanding they need to be successful learners, both during their time at Primary school and in later life. Curriculum Implementation – How is the curriculum developed, adopted and taught and assessed for Shawlands?

- Our Be Tree values drives our whole curriculum <u>resulting in</u> children who leave Shawlands confident, happy and prepared for 'the outside world'.
- We plan a clear sequence of lessons which enables quality first teaching to lead to high quality outcomes.
- We deliver clear, consistent and progressive teaching sequences <u>so that</u> pupils have a strong knowledge, skills and understanding for each curriculum area that contributes to meaningful, high quality outcomes.
- Key skills are taught explicitly when required, <u>so that</u> they can be mastered and applied within and across the curriculum and beyond.
- We have aspirational goals for our children, <u>developing</u> child's feeling of self-belief and self-worth.
- Knowledge is organised coherently to ensure progression <u>providing</u> pupils with strong, core knowledge across our curriculum.
- Frequent opportunities for recall are provided to our children <u>consolidating</u> learning so that it is internalised and retained.
- We develop children's understanding through rich learning opportunities and experiences <u>engaging</u> pupils so that they enjoy and remember their learning and are eager to learn more.
- We provide a language rich environment, with an emphasis on oracy and vocabulary, <u>equipping</u> children with skills so that they can thrive and become confident, literate individuals.
- We effectively use assessment for learning, which allows us to <u>identify</u> out next steps for pupils on their journey to mastery and depth and allows children to reflect on their own learning.
