Attendance

Regular attendance is crucial for several reasons. Consistent attendance ensures that students do not miss out on essential learning opportunities. It also helps them develop a sense of responsibility, which is a vital skill for their future. Furthermore, regular attendance contributes to the continuity of learning, making it easier for children to keep up with their peers and stay engaged with the curriculum.

You will have no doubt been made aware of the governments agenda around improving attendance in school. Schools are expected to do everything they can to improve attendance and support families if they require this. Our school has set a target attendance rate of 95% or higher for all children. This is in line with educational best practices and is designed to ensure that every student has the opportunity to reach their full potential. Over the past term our school overall attendance has dropped to 93.5 %. We understand that absences can occur for various reasons, including illness or family emergencies. Nonetheless, it is important that we work together whenever possible to ensure children are in school. If your child's attendance rate falls below 95%, you may receive a letter addressing this concern. The intention of this letter is not to reprimand but to work with you in finding solutions to improve your child's attendance as we are committed to working together. If you receive one of these letters over the following week and you have any concerns, please don't hesitate to contact me. If attendance drops below 90% you may be invited in for a meeting with myself and the Attendance officer (A Williamson) where we will offer support. If there is still no improvement, we will work with The EWO who may visit the family.

To help maintain and improve attendance rates, we encourage you to:

- make appointments and family holidays outside of school hours and during school breaks.
- Communicate with the school about any barriers to attendance so we can offer support.
- Emphasise the importance of regular attendance with your child. If your child is worried about anything in school, please don't hesitate to come into school to discuss these problems

We greatly appreciate your cooperation and support in this matter. Together, we can ensure that all our children have the best possible chance to succeed academically and personally.
